Stay connected, stay healthy, and Go Blue!






THIS COMMUNITY BEGINS WITH YOU





For Camilla, receiving a LEAD Scholarship granted her the freedom to focus on her academics and enjoy her entire college experience without financial anxiety — something she wouldn't have without you.

After being accepted into the University of Michigan, my first thoughts were: 'I can't believe I got in,' and 'how am I going to afford this?' My financial aid package was just short of what I needed to attend the University on a full ride.

When I was awarded the LEAD Scholarship, I was granted the financial security to pursue an education at Michigan—my dream school since I was a kid.

It was important to me to be financially stable in college because I knew that the less I had to worry about my financial situation, the more time that I would have to focus on school and my college experience instead of work. Support from

the LEAD Emergency Fund also allowed me to study abroad in Israel and Palestine, which gave me the opportunity to explore new cultures and learn about the Israel-Palestinian conflict in an immersed setting. LEAD didn't just support my trip; they made it possible.

This year, I had the privilege of taking a step back from my job as a server to focus completely on my academics and my extracurricular activities. My LEAD Scholarship gave me this freedom to make this choice for myself. I've never felt more balanced, and I've developed a schedule to better care for my mental health, which allows me to be more involved and attend more LEAD events.

The LEAD Scholars program encourages all students to unapologetically pursue their careers and passions and achieve success; they've fostered that kind of environment, and, because of that, I feel nothing but empowered to relentlessly pursue my goals. You have opened the door of opportunity for me, and I cannot thank you enough for it.
