The University of Michigan Club of Philadelphia offers a scholarship to one or more promising scholars from the Philadelphia metropolitan area that enroll as undergraduate students at the University of Michigan.

Eligibility requirements are noted below. Applications for the club scholarship must be submitted electronically by Friday April 7, 2023 for the 2023-2024 academic year. A committee of Club members will review the applications and select a pool of finalists for interviews on Saturday, April 15th, 2023.

Please send your completed application and an unofficial copy of your high school transcript and any college transcripts (including classes and grades through 1st semester of 12th grade, SAT/SATII scores, and any AP or IB scores) to David Owens at dowensgsb@gmail.com. Please note that you can send your unofficial high school and college transcripts via U.S. postal mail, as long as it arrives by the April 7th, 2023 deadline. However, no applications will be accepted via U.S. mail.

Provisions

Any student from the Philadelphia metropolitan area currently applying to the University of Michigan as an undergraduate may apply for this scholarship, although only students identified as having a high level of unmet financial need by the University Office of Financial Aid are eligible to receive the scholarship. If you are uncertain as to whether you will have sufficient unmet need as determined by the Office of Financial Aid, please contact the office for guidance. You may apply for the scholarship no later than the due date. Acceptance to and matriculation at the University is a prerequisite to receiving the award. You must submit an enrollment deposit to the University of Michigan at the time of scholarship award to indicate your acceptance of the scholarship.

A committee of Club members reviews the written applications. Several finalists will be invited to interview with the committee on Saturday, April 15th, 2023. The winner is announced in mid-late April.

Club scholarships are usually awarded for **one year only**, with one-half of the yearly award paid directly to the student's University account in August, and the other half paid to the account in January. The amount of the award, which is at the discretion of the University of Michigan Club of Philadelphia and the University of Michigan Office of Financial Aid, varies based on unmet financial need, candidate accomplishments, and results of the alumni interview. In past years, the target award amount has been between \$1,500 and \$8,000.
