Flavors of Tuscany | Itinerary Highlights (subject to change)

Day 1 EN ROUTE FROM U.S. Full travel day from U.S. ✈️

Day 2 ARRIVE IN FLORENCE, ITALY • CASTELLINA (D) Upon arrival an Orbridge representative will be waiting to assist with your transfer to the property. Take time to unpack and settle in before joining fellow travel companions for a convivial four-course welcome dinner.

Day 3 CASTELLO LA LECCIA (B,L,D) Today meet with chefs from the property for an informative, hands-on cooking experience. Learn the secrets of preparing traditional pasta and bread, then indulge on your creations during a leisurely lunch. The remainder of the afternoon take advantage of free time to fully immerse yourself in Castello La Leccia's varied amenities. Stroll through the meticulously maintained gardens where the fragrance of lavender and rosemary fills the air. Admire the endless panoramic views as you relax by the outdoor pool. Later gather together for a guided tour to explore the vineyards and production area. Learn about the winemaking process and savor the varietals during a tasting.

Day 4 PIENZA (B,L,D) Set out for the charming village of Pienza. Known as "the ideal city of the Renaissance," this UNESCO World Heritage Site was designed to exemplify the principles and philosophy of classical times and the great Italian Renaissance. Continue to Podere Il Casale, a small organic farm, to meet the owners Ulisse and Sandra—a husband-and-wife duo who moved from Switzerland to Tuscany in 1991 to pursue their dreams of creating a sustainable farm-to-table lifestyle. Join them for a tour of the grounds while gaining insight into the concept of the slow food movement. Be seated for lunch featuring ingredients grown on and harvested from the farm. Return to the property with time to freshen up before another five-star gastronomic experience—a four-course dinner paired with wines from the region.

Day 5 CORTONA (B,D) Travel to the hilltop town of Cortona where a local guide will escort you through neo-Gothic Santa Margherita Basilica, past Villa Bramasole, around Cortona's city center, and to the Etruscan museum. The remainder of the afternoon is at leisure to explore Cortona.

Day 6 VOLTERRA • SAN GIMIGNANO (B,D) Marvel at the ancient allure of Volterra—an Etruscan and Roman center high atop a hill in a volcanic region—surrounded by fortification walls. Famous for its alabaster quarries, the town's artisans carve unique handmade alabaster crafts and souvenirs. Continue to San Gimignano—the "New York of the Middle Ages" and UNESCO World Heritage Site—whose horizon of iconic towers resembles modern skyscrapers. During an inside visit of San Gimignano's Romanesque Duomo view colorful frescoes including *The Creation of Adam and Eve* and *Last Judgement*. Following lunch on your own meet Sergio Dondoli, master gelato creator and owner of Gelateria Dondoli, for a decadent tasting.

Day 7 MONTERIGGIONI • CASTELLINA IN CHIANTI (B,L,D) Visit the walled medieval village of Monteriggioni—a popular stop on the Via Francigena pilgrim trail. Walk by the medieval abbey at Abbazia a Isola, then stroll through the shops in the small village of Castellina in Chianti. This evening visit Badia a Coltibuono for a cooking class with Benedetta Vitali who will demonstrate the simple techniques and preparations of classic Tuscan dishes. Afterward gather in the dining room for a special dinner.

Day 8 SIENA (B,D) Today's highlight features a visit to Siena—a UNESCO World Heritage Site—to admire its remarkably well-preserved medieval cityscape. Spared from major modern industrial development, Siena's original 15th-century street plan and Gothic architecture remain unchanged. Explore the celebrated Duomo and admire the Sanctuary of Santa Caterina—a place of pilgrimage. During free time wander the shell-shaped Piazza del Campo. This afternoon meet Lorenzo Rossi, a third-generation artisan baker and owner of Il Magnifico. He will share his special family traditions of baking unique Siennese sweets. Tonight join fellow travel companions for a farewell dinner at Castello La Leccia to celebrate the captivating week spent exploring Tuscany.

Day 9 CASTELLINA • FLORENCE • DEPART FOR U.S. (B) After breakfast transfer to the airport for flights home.

(B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner)

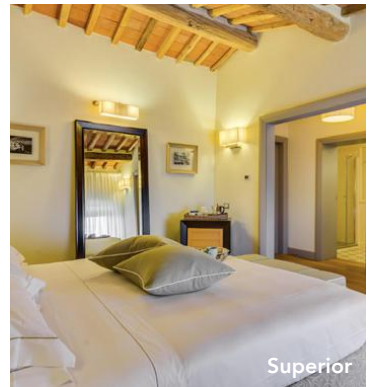
Historical sources cite that La Leccia castle's ownership was divided among 16 owners for strategic purposes. Near the mid-1400s, the Ricasoli family dominated a large part of the Chianti Classico region as well as the castle.

After being modified to serve more as a villa in the 18th century, the entire property was purchased in 1920 by Giuliano Daddi, great-grandfather of the current proprietors, and subsequently was the site of heavy bombardments during WWII that destroyed part of the tower, the last medieval testimony and devastated a wing of the villa.

Recently undergoing more than four years of careful and rigorous restoration, the castle and the surrounding garden have returned to life.

With a focus on sustainability and the environment, the original spaces remain intact but feature modern enhancements using eco-compatible materials and technologies. To warm the surroundings, wooden floors, beamed ceilings, pastel colors and furniture were designed exclusively for the common spaces and made by Florentine craftsmen.

Each room offers climate control, desk, LCD TV, complimentary Wi-Fi, phone, safe, minibar, and en suite bathroom with a shower or tub and shower, sundries and hairdryer.

Optional Post-Tour Florence

Florence is arguably the cultural capital of Europe and the showcase of Renaissance exuberance. Lovers of beauty, art and history can extend their experience in Tuscany to embrace the treasures of this magnificent city.

Day 9 **DEPART CASTELLINA • ARRIVE IN FLORENCE (L)**
Upon arrival meet a local art historian guide for a walking tour of the historic city center. In Piazza della Repubblica discover the city's beginnings as a Roman settlement. Wander through narrow streets past the fortified houses and towers that marked the medieval town. See the Duomo and Ponte Vecchio then cap off the morning with lunch at the local market. Walk through the market shops where families have been serving up culinary treasures for generations. Taste different local specialties, such as not-to-be-missed finocchiona salami or Tuscan crostino, paired with a glass of fine Chianti. Visit an artisanal shop specializing in hand-decorated paper. Learn about the history of marbling then take part in a hands-on activity creating your own marbled paper as a keepsake. The evening at leisure.

Day 10 **FLORENCE (B)** Join your guide and walk to the historic center to visit the Baptistry of San Giovanni, one of the oldest churches in Florence and a symbol of the city. With an octagonal plan it represents a masterpiece of Romanesque architecture. Next enjoy a tour of the Uffizi Gallery† which has drawn visitors to view masterpieces by important artists of the Renaissance, including Da Vinci, Giotto, Botticelli, Tiziano and Michelangelo. The remainder of the afternoon is at leisure to explore the city at your own pace.

Day 11 **FLORENCE • DEPART FOR U.S. (B)** After breakfast guests departing during the suggested times take the complimentary transfer to the airport for flights home.

- 2 breakfasts and 1 lunch (a local market experience and tasting)
- Guided art history and cultural tour, plus a panoramic walking tour of Florence's historical highlights
- Visit to an artisanal workshop (leather or jewelry)

- Luggage portorage
- Gratuities to local guide, drivers and porters
