On August 30, 2021 the University of Michigan Club of Downriver presented their President's scholarships. Katie Hartwell, the Scholarship chairperson for the club presented the awards. The President's scholarship goes to excellent Downriver high school graduates now attending U of M and maintaining high academic standards at the same time bearing most of the burden of the cost of their education. They all have demonstrated a huge determination to earn their undergraduate degree in spite of financial constraints.

Unlike last year when the world seemed to be in suspended animation, this year the club received a

huge number of applications. The application process was rigorous. The students had to fill out a long application form detailing the loans they had taken out, the grants and scholarships they had received, and their jobs during the school semesters and in the summer. They provided their transcripts to date, and wrote an essay describing their financial situation especially how FAFSA might have underestimated their need.

Ms. Hartwell asked the entire board of the club to read the financial need essays of each student and decide which five they would choose to receive the scholarship. Those essays were very influential in helping us choose the recipients but of course not the only criterion. Each of these students deserves a ton of credit for their determination and hard work.

The recipients in alphabetical order are:

Rosa Garcia is a senior in Literature, Science and Arts (LSA) in Ann Arbor studying Environment and carries a 3.5 GPA. Rosa is a first generation college student in

her family. She graduated from Lincoln Park High School in 2018.

Adam Groat is a senior at the Dearborn campus and is studying Criminal Justice. With his nearly perfect GPA it is amazing that he has been able to work incredible hours so that after 3 years he has no student debt. The pandemic actually helped him to work full time while going to school. He was 2017 graduate of Wyandotte Roosevelt High School.

Jenna Majeske is studying Early Childhood Education at Dearborn campus where she is a senior with a 3.9 GPA. Hers was the first application to arrive in our mailbox almost two months before it was due. She has worked many jobs related to her field in early childhood development. Jenna

graduated from Southgate Anderson High School in 2018.

Rosario Moreno-Nava is studying Computer Science in Ann Arbor and is a senior carrying a 3.1 GPA. She is a 2018 graduate from Lincoln Park High School. She has not only worked in the dining halls at school, but tutors students in her field.

Gabe Pascua is studying Biopsychology, Cognition, and Neuroscience in Ann Arbor where he is a senior with a 3.96 GPA. He loves and respects his parents for leaving the Philippines and bringing their 2 sons to the United States so they could get a fine education. He is a 2019 graduate of Gabriel Richard High School and plans to go to medical school.

Shelbie Taylor is a sophomore in Ann Arbor studying Biology, Health, and Society where she carries a 3.96 GPA. At the university she works doing research in the Environment Science Department. She is a 2020 graduate of Woodhaven High School. Shelbie plans to go to medical school after she completes her undergraduate work.

The Club met on Monday, May 9th, for its annual scholarship dinner at Arnaldo's Banquet Center in Riverview. The Club awarded three graduating high school students with Leaders and Best Scholarships. Also, the club had invited top juniors from all the Downriver high schools to learn more about the University and how to apply.

The U of M Ann Arbor Associate Director of Admissions Kelly Cox (Roosevelt High School Graduate) explained to the high school students the opportunity they have to attend a world class university right in their own state. He gave details on how and when to apply and answered questions from the students.

Eva Gogola represented the Dearborn campus admissions department and related the advantages of U of M Dearborn.

After dinner, scholarship chairperson Katie Hartwell presented three Leaders and Best \$1,500 scholarships. She thanked the board of the club for their help in reading the applicants' essays. In

addition, she thanked club members at large for assisting in the decision process. They are: Rebecca Markus, Cornolia Wright, Amy Rossi, Rebecca Jablonski, Emily Solomchuck.

The criteria for deciding our scholarship recipients include: scholarship in high school, their standardized test scores, their college prep course work including all the AP classes and any dual enrollment, their extra-curricular activities, their leadership positions and work experience, their writing ability as evidenced in their essay. The top 5 applicants at that point of the decision process were interviewed on Face Time.

The John and Sue Ghindia Leaders and Best award went to **Anna Bruce**. Anna will soon graduate of Trenton HS where she is the salutatorian. She has taken 9 Advanced placement classes in addition to taking 4 dual enrollment college classes. Her school activities include being captain of the school's color guard, acting in school plays, and member of interact service organization. In addition, she found time for a part-time job at Panera Bread and modeling jobs.

The recipient of the Kenneth Hartwell Leaders and Best award goes to **Brooklyn Luscomb** of Roosevelt High School. Brooklyn is 8th in her class of over 250 members at Roosevelt High. Her transcript is all A s and A+s. She has taken 12 semesters of AP classes or college level classes. She is editor in chief of her yearbook, VP of fundraising for DECA, VP of Student council, team captain of the varsity swim team, and plays varsity tennis.

The Lloyd Carr Leaders and Best Scholarship was awarded to **Mandy Chen** from Woodhaven High School where she is the valedictorian of the class of '22. Here is another well-rounded student who has definitely not taken the easy route through high school. She has taken 17 semesters of college level classes. She is treasurer of 3 organizations National Honor Society, Student council all 4 years, and Students Against Destructive Decisions. She does hospital volunteering at Beaumont hospital, and is a section leader for low brass in the marching band among other activities. She is a very good writer as evidenced by winning the DAR's essay contest on

citizenship and the insightful essay she wrote for this application.

The evening concluded with a talk from last year's John and Sue Ghindia scholarship recipient Ava Peryam. She related to the high school juniors present that though the university is large, once you get involved in an organization or two and find your area of study, the university no longer seems as large. Oh and by the way she said the football games at the Big House were loads of fun!
