

Caves, Corals, and Mayan Wonders

NOVEMBER 2 - 8, 2022



From lush rainforests and coral reefs teeming with life to ancient ruins and ceremonial structures,

Belize is a trove of natural and cultural treasures to discover. Visit mountains, reserves, caves, and Maya sites inland. Then, head to the coast to explore the mangroves, cayes, and underwater world of the Belize Barrier Reef, the second largest reef system in the world. During your journey, encounter wildlife, learn about efforts to preserve this small but remarkable country, and meet with local residents, including conservationists and musicians.

PROGRAM **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Observe tapirs, jaguars, and Harpy Eagles at the worldrenowned Belize Zoo.
- Delve into the Maya underworld at Actun Tunichil Muknal cave, a Maya ceremonial burial ground and site of the "Crystal Maiden" skeletal remains.
- Swim and snorkel in the South Water Caye Marine Reserve, one of the most biodiverse marine areas in all of Belize.
- Kayak the Sittee River and watch for iguanas, crocodiles, toucans, and other wildlife.
- Climb to the top of El Castillo pyramid, the second tallest man-made structure in Belize, at Xunantunich, the country's most accessible Maya site of significance.





ITINERARY

B,L,D = BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER

NOVEMBER 2 - ARRIVAL/BELIZE CITY

Upon arrival at the airport in Belize City, you will be met and transferred to the ocean-front Radisson Fort George Hotel. Please note check-in time is 3 pm. Early evening program orientation with your Belizean group leader, followed by a welcome dinner at the hotel. Overnight at Radisson Fort George Hotel. (D)

NOVEMBER 3 - BELMOPAN

This morning after breakfast, visit the Belize Zoo. Situated upon 29 acres of tropical savanna, the zoo exhibits over 150 animals representing more than 45 species, all native to Belize. The zoo is home to orphaned, rescued, and rehabilitated animals as well as those born at the zoo or sent as donations from other zoological institutions. Upon arrival, receive an introduction to the animals of Belize and visit the exhibits. Highlights include the jaguar rehabilitation program, the harpy eagle exhibit, and the Baird's tapir enclosure. Have lunch at Cheers restaurant and then continue to Sleeping Giant Rainforest Lodge, located along the Sibun River with views of the mountains and rainforest. This evening after dinner, take a walk around the lodge to look for nocturnal wildlife. Overnight at Sleeping Giant Rainforest Lodge. (BLD)

NOVEMBER 4 - BELMOPAN

After breakfast, explore the Maya underworld during a visit to Actun Tunichil Muknal cave. This excursion combines land and river hiking and caving, beginning with a 45-minute hike up the Roaring River Valley and through the rainforest of the Tapir Mountain Nature Reserve to the entrance of the cave. Explore this geologically fascinating cave and also the main attraction, the "Cathedral" chamber, which was a Maya ceremonial and burial ground. Later this afternoon, return to the hotel for dinner and overnight. *Overnight at Sleeping Giant Rainforest Lodge.* (BLD)

NOVEMBER 5 - HOPKINS

Following breakfast, cross the Mopan River via a hand-winched ferry at the Maya village of San Jose Succotz for a visit to Xunantunich, Belize's most accessible Maya site of significance. The site's dominant structure, El Castillo, rises 130 feet above the jungle floor, offering superb views of western Belize with forest stretching out all around and the rest of the ancient city mapped out beneath you. Have lunch at a local restaurant and then check in at the beachfront Jaguar Reef Lodge. The remainder of the day is at leisure to enjoy the beach and view the sunset before dinner at the lodge. *Overnight at Jaguar Reef Lodge. (BLD)*

NOVEMBER 6 - HOPKINS

Enjoy breakfast, then board our boat for a 30-minute ride to the South Water Caye Marine Reserve for snorkeling on the pristine coral reef. Explore the mangroves both above and below the surface. Also cruise along Man O' War Caye reserve to see nesting frigatebirds and the brown booby. Enjoy a picnic on one of the remote islands. In the afternoon, travel to the nearby Lebeha Drumming Center in Hopkins Village for an introduction to the culture of the Afro-indigenous Garifuna peoples. A local expert will introduce us to the importance of drums and music, and skilled drummers will treat us to a performance. We will have the opportunity to learn some drumming skills and dance moves ourselves. Dinner on own to sample the local cuisine. *Overnight at Jaguar Reef Lodge. (BL)*

NOVEMBER 7 - HOPKINS

After breakfast, gather for an excursion to the Sittee River for relaxed kayaking and nature viewing. We hope to see colorful birds, iguana, turtles, and an occasional crocodile. Lunch is on own. Afternoon at leisure. This evening, enjoy a farewell dinner at the lodge. Overnight at Jaguar Reef Lodge. (BD)

NOVEMBER 8 - FAREWELL!

This morning, group transfer to local airport for flight to Belize International Airport and then international flights back to the U.S. Please note check-out is 11 am. Please book international flight after 2 pm. (B)

Not Included in Your Tour Price International airfare from your departure city; costs of passports; personal expenses such as beverages, laundry, room service, and meals not specified; communications charges; and trip cancellation insurance. Additional baggage fees levied directly by the airline(s) may apply and are subject to change at any time. You should confirm directly with your airline(s) prior to departure.

International Air Transportation Estimated airfare: \$689 from Detroit to Belize City. Holbrook Travel offers group airfare and ticketing. Group transfers between the airport and hotel are included in your program cost. A note about online airfare: Occasionally, you may be able to find airfares online that are listed at a lower cost. In general, individual fares lack the flexibility of group airfare and often require immediate purchase. You will receive your preliminary air schedule approximately 2½ months prior to departure. Please note that seat assignments on your international flight are usually done at airport check-in. Holbrook Travel is unable to guarantee any seat assignments. Due to the nature of tour operator tickets, other restrictions apply, including but not limited to, frequent flyer mileage accrual, stopovers, alternate travel dates, upgrades, and airline taxes and departure fees. If you prefer to make your own travel arrangements, booking the tour "Land Only" is available. We recommend that if you choose to make your own airline reservations, you do not purchase non-refundable tickets or those with high penalties for changes.
