



The Big Five

When colonial-era hunters descended on Africa in the late 1800s, they were on a quest for adventure and the "trophy" of taking home one of what became known as the Big Five—the lion, leopard, Cape buffalo, black rhinoceros, and the African savanna elephant. In addition to being deemed the most dangerous, these five African mammal species were considered the most challenging to capture.

With trophy hunting now highly discouraged, the thrill of the modern safari is to witness these spectacular creatures in their natural habitat—collecting images of some of the most spectacular wildlife on the planet. Keep your cameras and binoculars ready for Big Five game viewing and bird watching on our land safari through Chobe National Park, followed by a three-day cruise down the Chobe River to the edge of Namibia.

Experience the awe of this region as we journey from Zimbabwe to the fertile floodplains of Botswana, a sanctuary for one of Africa's greatest concentrations of fauna, including nearly 120,000 elephants and vast numbers of zebra, giraffe, lion, buffaloes, leopard, rhinos, and the rare puku antelope. And don't forget to look down, as the elusive hippo and crocodile have been known to make an appearance in the river itself.

Step back in time to pivotal moments in South Africa's anti-apartheid movement and Nelson Mandela's autobiography, Long Walk to Freedom. Inspiring visits and illuminating discussions reveal the historic 20th-century milestones that culminated in the momentous inauguration of South Africa's first Black president—laying the foundation for progressive economic, social, and political prosperity. Follow in Mandela's footsteps through Soweto, visiting his former home on renowned Vilakazi Street, and explore UNESCO World Heritage-designated Robben Island, the isolated former outpost for political prisoners off the coast of Cape Town. Stand before the Union Buildings in Pretoria, where Mandela was inaugurated in 1994 after South Africa held the first multiracial democratic general election in its history. On April 27, 1995, the first commemoration of Freedom Day—a public holiday celebrating the anniversary of that historic moment—Mandela addressed the people of South Africa with considerable optimism about the "past from which we come as a nation; the great possibilities that we now have; and the bright future that beckons us." Mandela's legacy as an activist, leader, and great humanitarian still resonates today.

Johannesburg, South Africa Day 2

Arrive in cosmopolitan
Johannesburg, known colloquially
as "Joburg," and check into the
5-star FAIRLAWNS BOUTIQUE
HOTEL & SPA. Join fellow travelers
for a Welcome Reception
and Dinner. (R,D)

Johannesburg for Pretoria Day 3

North of Johannesburg, vibrant Pretoria is South Africa's administrative capital, known for its distinctly Afrikaans culture, stunning architecture, and ubiquitous purple-blossomed jacaranda trees. Visit the monolithic Voortrekker Monument, honoring the mid-19th-century Dutch voortrekkers who migrated from the British-controlled Cape Colony to the inland Highveld region. See the sandstone Union Buildings

and the formal garden where Nelson Mandela delivered his historic presidential inauguration speech in 1994. (B,L,D)

Johannesburg for Soweto Day 4

Follow in the footsteps of Nobel Peace Prize laureate Nelson Mandela alona Vilakazi Street and visit the house where he lived from 1946 to 1962. a short distance from the former home of fellow Nobel Peace Prize laureate Desmond Tutu. Visit Johannesburg's poignant Apartheid Museum to trace South Africa's 21st-century journey to democracy—gaining insight into the realities of township life through its powerful artifacts, photographs, and film footage. (B,L)

Johannesburg/ Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe Day 5

Fly to Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe, and check into the elegant and historic 5-star VICTORIA FALLS HOTEL. Enjoy lunch on your own and join the group that evening for dinner. (B,D)

Victoria Falls Day 6


Walk the jungle-fringed trail along the edge of UNESCO-inscribed Victoria Falls, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. Here, the Zambezi River plunges into a narrow, 360-foot gorge—twice the height of Niagara Falls—creating frothy rapids and vaulting a colorful mist into the air. Your afternoon is at leisure. (B)

Victoria Falls/Kasane, Botswana/Namibia Day 7

Travel to Botswana for a morning game drive in Chobe National Park. Watch for elephants, wild dogs, zebras, and giraffes. In the afternoon, embark the ZAMBEZI QUEEN, a 5-star river boat, to prepare







for your safari cruise along the Chobe River. (B,L,D)

Cruising the Chobe River Day 8 and Day 9

Enjoy up-close views of wildlife, including the Big Five as well as giraffe, kudu, oryx, and an astounding array of bird species as you cruise for these two days. Expert local guides will lead game-viewing river safaris aboard small excursion boats through this unspoiled ecosystem. You will also visit a local Namibian village to experience its unique culture firsthand. (B,L,D)

Kasane/Cape Town, South Africa Day 10

Disembark the river boat in Kasane and transfer to the airport. Fly to Cape Town, South Africa, and check into the iconic, 5-star BELMOND MOUNT NELSON HOTEL at the foot of Table Mountain. Enjoy an evening at leisure. (B,L)

Cape Town/ Table Mountain/ Robben Island Day 11

Take a cable car ride to the top of Table Mountain for spectacular views, followed by a scenic drive through the city and view the Bo-Kaap and District Six area. This afternoon, you have the option of going on an included excursion to UNESCO-designated Robben Island, where Mandela and other political prisoners made strides during apartheid. The prison's storied interior and its guides—former prisoners, many of whom served with Mandela—provide an invaluable perspective on South Africa's social and political transformation. (B)

Cape Town/Cape Point Day 12

Experience a panoramic drive with photo stops en route to Cape Point, a nature reserve

within Table Mountain National Park. Visit the Africa Penguin Colony on Boulders Beach. Arrive at Cape Point and take the Flying Dutchman Funicular for incredible views over the Cape of Good Hope. (B,L)

Cape Town/ Cape Winelands Day 13

Drive to Cape Winelands and the world-class estate of Vergelegen for a wine tasting. Explore the picturesque formal gardens and historic Cape Dutch manor house, then continue to Boschendal for lunch. (B.L.R)

Cape Town/ Return to Home City Day 14 and Day 15

Check out of the hotel and fly back to your home city, arriving the next day. (B)


