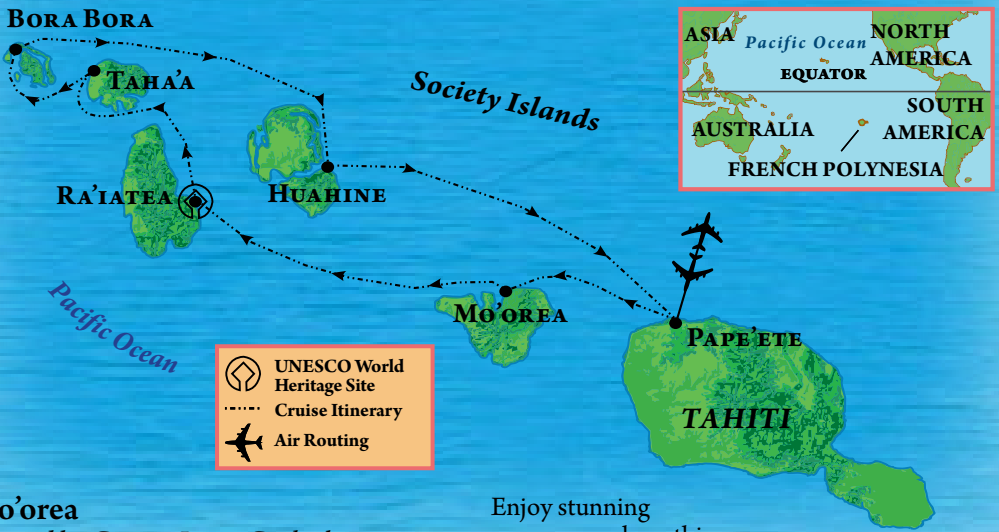
Pape'ete, Tahiti, Society Islands

Pape'ete is the spirited capital of French Polynesia, framed by a seductive backdrop of forest-clad peaks. Tahiti's quintessential South Pacific port is infused with a vibrant blend of Tahitian, French and Chinese cultural traditions.

Tahiti's stunning West Coast is historically significant, notably the sacred 'Arahurahu site—French Polynesia's only fully restored *marae* (ceremonial site)—and the beautifully landscaped Spring Garden of Vaipahi, which showcases 75 plant species, including precious *māpē* (Tahitian chestnut). Crystal-clear freshwater pools and fern-veiled caves represent Mara'a Grotto. The name Pape'ete translates to "water basket," referencing a time in the island's history when Tahitians came here to fill their calabashes (made from gourds) with fresh water.

Tahiti's East Coast is the former home of American author James Norman Hall, best known for *Mutiny on the Bounty*. Point Venus on the north side of Tahiti was named for the Fort Venus observatory established by Captain James Cook in 1769.





Mo'orea

Revered by Captain James Cook, the heart-shaped island of Mo'orea inspired Herman Melville's novel *Omoo*, James Michener's classic *Tales of the South Pacific* and the song "Bali Ha'i." Admire this spectacular landscape of ancient volcanic peaks, lush valleys and emerald lagoons.



Take in the signature views of Mount Otemanu and Mount Pahia, Bora Bora's trademark conical peaks.

From renowned Belvedere Point, marvel at an unforgettable view of the iconic rocky spur of Mount Rotu'i and the sparkling waters of Cook and 'Opunohu Bays. Mystical stone *marae* evoke Mo'orea's French Polynesian heritage, while European churches underscore its role as a center for 19th-century missionary activity.

Contemporary islanders continue the traditions of their forebears, farming pineapples and papayas and crafting indigenous art from seashells and exotic wood amid Mo'orea's vibrant blue lagoon.

See the glittering ring of tiny motus with white sand beaches surrounding the seldom-visited island of Taha'a, a serenity awash with the soothing aroma of vanilla wafting from secluded plantations.

Enjoy stunning panoramas along this legendary South Seas idyll featuring birds of paradise, verdant hibiscus gardens and houses painted in pastel hues.

Ra'iatea

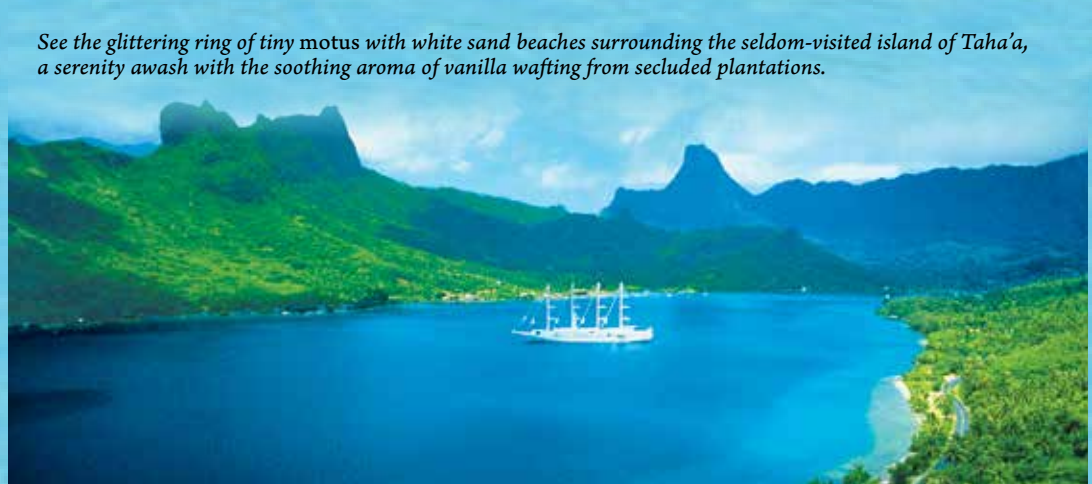
Ra'iatea, which translates to "faraway heaven," served as the political and spiritual heart of the Society Islands in the precolonial era. Exalted as French Polynesia's most sacred island and considered the ancestral home of the Māori, Ra'iatea is the legendary birthplace of 'Oro, god of war and fertility.

The UNESCO World Heritage site of Taputapu'atea is a well-preserved *marae* complex representing the intersection of the living and ancestral worlds. Experience the "ash-blue sky alive with stars" that Impressionist Henri Matisse so memorably described as you cruise along this second largest of the Society Islands.

Taha'a

Taha'a is framed by the profile of Mount Ohiri, named for Hiro, Polynesian god of sailors and thieves. Today, the world's most flavorful vanilla beans and the region's distinctive black pearl oysters provide the islanders' livelihoods.

Savor sweet aromas wafting down from the island's many vanilla farms on this captivating island. Enjoy views of *motu* (coral outlets) with pristine white sand beaches and overwater bungalows along tranquil cerulean waters. Includes a BBQ lunch on the private Motu Mahaea.





Delight in breathtaking scenery in Ra’iatea, which translates to “faraway heaven.” Considered the cultural cradle of French Polynesia, the island’s verdant green mountains rise to the peak of the majestic Mount Temehani.

Bora Bora

The proverbial vision of paradise, Bora Bora’s basalt peaks cloaked in thick tropical forest rise from sparkling turquoise waters. On the shores of picturesque Fa’anui Bay, see the 15th-century *marae* of Fare Opu, adorned with petroglyphs of turtles, a sacred creature in French Polynesia. Bunkers constructed by American soldiers during World War II, when the main island served as a military supply base in the South Pacific under the name “Operation Bobcat” remain here.

In the island’s forested interior, local customs and traditions—including the Tahitian art of dyeing *pareos* (wrap-around garments)—are still practiced in the shadow of Mount Otemanu, Bora Bora’s highest peak. A catamaran departure from the ship for a Tahitian inspired dinner on the private Motu Tapu will be provided.

Huahine

Idyllic Huahine consists of two islands—Huahine-Nui and Huahine-Iti, or “big” and “small,” respectively—separated by a deep blue bay and ringed by a coral atoll. Just above Maeva, Mata’irea Hill preserves the greatest concentration of archaeological sites in French Polynesia.

Enjoy incredible snorkeling opportunities in the pristine, sparkling waters of French Polynesia.



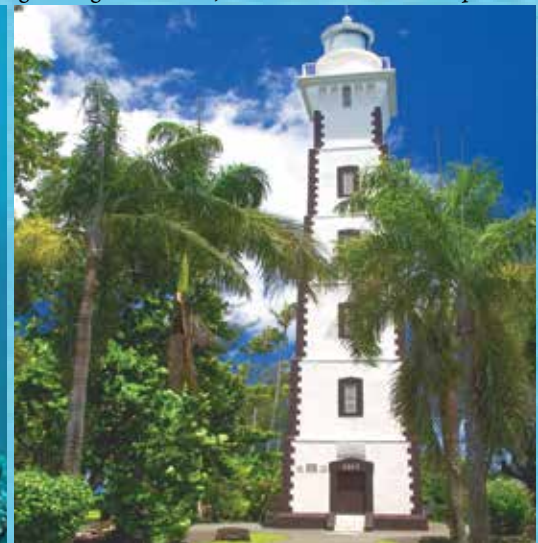



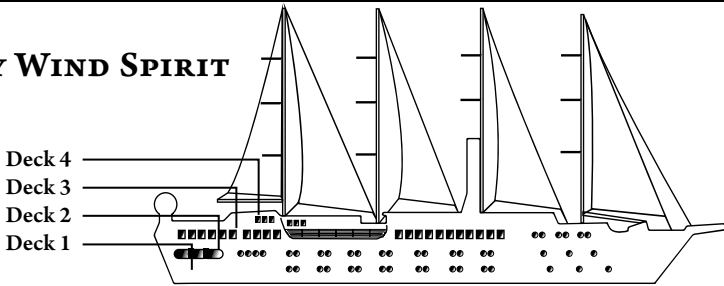
The Lure of the South Pacific

The turquoise waters, wind-sculpted peaks and white-sand beaches of French Polynesia have captivated visitors for centuries. A dreamscape long before explorers Captain James Cook, Samuel Wallis and Louis de Bougainville fell under their spell in the 1700s, this fabled earthly paradise was among the last places in the world to be settled by humans. Today, Tahitian folklore traditions and mythology are entwined with the legacy of Mā'ohi ancestors, ancient Samoan mariners and European explorers who used the stars, sun, tides and flight patterns of birds to navigate the Pacific Ocean to these idyllic shores.

Seared into the collective consciousness by the paintings of post-Impressionist artist Paul Gauguin, this fantasia of 118 islands and atolls remains steeped in the legends of a polytheistic society. The French Polynesian reverence for nature coexists with time-honored agrarian traditions while the intersection of the material and spirit world is revealed in esoteric *marae* (ceremonial sites). Extolled for their mesmerizing landscapes and rich cultural traditions, the mystical pull of these serene isles is impossible to resist.
