Program Highlights:

- During a full day tour of Quito, marvel at the gold leaf interior of the Jesuit Church of La Compañía—a fine example of the mix of European influences and indigenous art called the Baroque school of Quito; enjoy a lunch of Ecuadorian specialties; and view a unique collection of pre-Columbian art.
- Observe with remarkable proximity the diversity of endemic species such as the Nazca and blue-footed boobies; giant tortoises; marine and land iguanas; the flightless Galapagos cormorant; and the famous Darwin's finches.
- Discover the myriad of aquatic wildlife in the clear waters of the world's second largest marine reserve.
- Snorkel with sea lions, colorful tropical fish, and sea turtles—or observe them through a glass bottom boat.
- Explore secluded inlets and stroll sweeping white sand beaches such as Punta Espinoza, where flightless cormorants nest nearby and sea lions, Galapagos penguins, and turtles can be seen frolicking in a fine display of multi-species tolerance in the nearby lagoon.
- Visit dramatic and historic places, including the Charles Darwin Research Station—the iconic site of Galapagos National Park research and conservation efforts—most notable for its captive breeding program for the Galapagos Giant Tortoise; and Sullivan Bay on Santiago Island, one of the first sites visited by Charles Darwin featuring a "lunar landscape" of lava fields.
- What's included: 2 nights at the 5-star Casa Gangotena hotel in Quito prior to embarkation; 4 nights aboard the *Isabela II*, with exploration by panga or glass-bottom boat, naturalist-led hikes and excursions, and evening lectures; 1 night at Wyndham Guayaquil after disembarkation; a welcome reception in Quito, 7 breakfasts, 6 lunches, and 4 dinners (served with house wine), including a farewell dinner; all excursions and presentations; complimentary use of kayaks, paddle boards, shorty wetsuits, and snorkeling equipment; Galapagos National Park entrance fee and transit card; internal airfare (from Quito to the islands on day 3, and return to Guayaquil on day 7); gratuities to local guides, hotel porters, and drivers in Quito, the Galapagos Islands, and Guayaquil; and airport transfers for guests arriving and departing during the suggested times.



Itinerary:

Day 1: En Route from U.S. / Arrive in Quito, Ecuador

Tuesday, April 13, 2021 After an evening arrival in Quito, transfer to your award-winning hotel for a comfortable night's sleep. *Overnight: Casa Gangotena – Quito*

Day 2: Quito

Wednesday, April 14, 2021

Head out for a full-day, guided tour of historic Old Town. A local expert will take you through the Quito neighborhood called San Roque, where you'll visit with local artisans, including shopkeepers, hat makers, and sweet confectioners. Explore the San Francisco Market—one of the oldest in the capital. There, learn about unique Ecuadorian fruits and vegetables, as well as local culinary traditions.

Continue your journey to the cobbled street of La Ronda, featuring balconies festooned with colorful flags. Stop by a chocolatier to learn how cacao beans are processed, and taste the finest chocolates of Ecuador!

Next, head north toward the political heart of the city. Following a brief narrative, stroll to the Jesuit church of La Compañía to admire its stunning gold-leaf interior. A lunch of Ecuadorian specialties, featuring Cocina Mestiza—a perfect blend of international flavors and locally sourced ingredients—will be served at the beautiful Theatrum Restaurant.

In the afternoon, head to the Casa del Alabado Archaeological Museum, within a restored 17th-century colonial mansion, to view its collection of pre-Columbian art. This evening, meet your traveling companions for a welcome reception and prepare for your upcoming adventure.

Overnight: Casa Gangotena – Quito (B,L,R)

Day 3: Quito / Flight to Baltra / Santa Cruz: Highlands / Puerto Ayora – Embarkation Thursday, April 15, 2021

Arrive by plane to Baltra Airport and transfer to the Itabaca Channel to ferry across to Santa Cruz Island. After a short, scenic drive across Santa Cruz Island, arrive in the Highlands to enjoy lunch.

Later, visit the Charles Darwin Research Station and the Giant Tortoise Breeding Center to

gain an understanding of the extensive conservation efforts that have gone into maintaining and improving the environment and biodiversity in this remarkable archipelago. See the Galapagos giant tortoise up close on paths leading through arid-zone vegetation, and learn about the various stages of tortoise care and development including a visit to the baby tortoise house.

Take a late afternoon stroll along the main street of Puerto Ayora before embarking on *Isabela II*.

Join the captain this evening for a cocktail and briefing on the exciting activities to come. *Overnight: Isabela II (B,L,D)*

Day 4: Bartolomé / Santiago: Sullivan Bay

Friday, April 16, 2021

One of today's highlights includes a panoramic view of the Galapagos from a special vantage point—an overlook atop Bartolomé Island. On a pristine day, more than 10 islands can be seen from this viewpoint.

Return to the beach to board dinghies for a cruise around Pinnacle Rock, formed by an eroded tuff-stone cone—light limestone created by the accumulation of small volcanic elements. Pinnacle Rock is home for a small colony of the flightless Galapagos penguin, which shares the area with sea lions and other marine birds.

After lunch, explore Sullivan Bay on the east coast of Santiago Island featuring a white coral sand beach that's ideal for swimming. This location has some of the best snorkeling within the archipelago. See and feel the volcanic origin of Galapagos by traversing the walking trail across a lava field consisting of lava that flowed here in 1897, and the lava shapes are the enigmatic volcanic features.

Overnight: Isabela II (B,L,D)

Day 5: Santa Cruz: Dragon Hill / Santiago: Salt Mine James Bay

Saturday, April 17, 2021

The island of Santa Cruz is the only one with six different vegetation zones. Pit craters, Scalesia forest, cacti and ferns are found here. After breakfast, set off on a walk, passing a lagoon frequented by shorebirds, ducks, and American flamingos. Continuing inland, the trail offers a beautiful view of the bay and the western islands of the archipelago, as well as the chance of observing land iguanas. Afterward, snorkel from the shore in hopes of spotting rays and green turtles.

Later, visit James Bay on Santiago Island, where Charles Darwin spent six days exploring in 1835, encountering finches, mockingbirds, lava lizards, yellow warblers, as well as Galapagos doves, hawks, and flamingos. Take note of the fascinating geological formations as you hike uphill for an incredible panoramic view of a crater filled with brackish water. The salt from this lagoon was mined in the 20th century, but the businesses didn't prosper. *Overnight: Isabela II (B,L,D)*

Day 6: Isabela: Punta Vicente Roca / Fernandina: Punta Espinoza

Sunday, April 18, 2021

Explore the captivating coast of Isabela Island by dinghy, seeking out abundant wildlife including colonies of Galapagos fur seals, the nesting sites of Nazca boobies, flightless cormorants, penguins, and marine iguanas. Depending on conditions, there may be a chance to snorkel along the cliffs, hopefully in the company of green sea turtles. Back on board, navigate along the Bolivar Channel, where nutrient-rich upwellings provide fertile fishing grounds for cetaceans.

Then visit the island of Fernandina, the youngest island of the archipelago and arguably one of the most pristine ecosystems on the planet. Punta Espinoza boasts an amazing combination of barren landscapes and abundant wildlife, all dominated by the lofty volcano at the heart of the island. Highlights to spot include hawks, penguins, huge numbers of marine iguanas, and the famous flightless cormorant, with its beguiling blue eyes.

This evening, join fellow guests and crew for a festive farewell toast followed by dinner. *Overnight: Isabela II (B,L,D)*

Day 7: Baltra – Disembarkation / Flight to Guayaquil, Ecuador

Monday, April 19, 2021 Bid a fond adiós to the *Isabela II* crew this morning prior to departing Baltra for Guayaquil, where you will spend your final night. *Overnight: Wyndham Guayaquil (B,L)*

Day 8: Guayaquil / Depart for U.S.

Tuesday, April 20, 2021

After breakfast, guests departing during the suggested times will take a complimentary transfer to the airport for flights home. Guests continuing on the post-tour will enjoy leisure time in Guayaquil before flying to Lima, Peru, for an evening arrival. (*B*)

B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner, R = Reception

Activity Level:

Moderate

Guests should be sure-footed on stairs and able to walk at least one mile on rocky, volcanic, and uneven ground, as some nature hikes will be on irregular and steep terrain. Guests should also be comfortable managing beach landings and boarding small vessels, both from shore and the deck of the *Isabela II*. Also keep in mind that you will experience varying altitudes, to which you may not be accustomed.

Maximum elevation: 9,350 feet in Quito, Ecuador



Optional Pre-Tour:

MASHPI LODGE



The breathtaking surroundings of the Mashpi Rainforest Biodiversity Reserve look and feel like a dream—misty clouds, crashing waterfalls, and endemic species of wildlife found in the Ecuadorian Chocó, one of the most diverse ecosystems in the world. Take the unparalleled opportunity to visit both a cloud forest and a rainforest—each rich with a myriad of flora and fauna species in every layer from below the forest floor to above the canopy.

Spend your days exploring hidden paths, discovering colorful flora and fauna, and relaxing amidst the contemporary comforts of Mashpi Lodge, located within this private reserve consisting of roughly 70% lush primary forest in its 3,212 acres.

Itinerary:

Day +1: Arrive Quito, Ecuador Saturday, April 10, 2021 Arrive at your hotel to relax and refresh before tomorrow's full day of activities. *Overnight: Casa Gangotena*

Day +2: Mashpi Lodge / Mashpi Reserve

Sunday, April 11, 2021

After an early breakfast, depart via group transfer, journeying through the northwest corner of Quito's Metropolitan District. Embrace the sweeping landscape along the western flank of the Andes next to La Mitad del Mundo (The Middle of the World), which marks the equatorial line. Along the way, stop to stretch your legs before continuing the final descent into the Mashpi Reserve. Observe the changes in vegetation with every significant drop in altitude, following the course of the Rio Blanco.

After 3.5 hours, arrive at Mashpi Lodge where the staff and your naturalist guides greet you and conduct a quick briefing.

Enjoy lunch, settle into your room, and perhaps take a brief rest. In the afternoon, you'll have the opportunity to begin one of the activities. Perhaps take a guided hike to one of several waterfalls or follow the Howler Monkey Trail to the Life Centre, which educates visitors about the butterfly's life cycle and other wildlife found in Mashpi. Here, relax in lounge chairs set on an expansive observation deck to spot wildlife, and later, visit the adjacent butterfly house.

As the evening sets in, take an optional guided night walk along the Luminous Trail in search of large and small (and some transparent!) creatures, including frogs, snakes, insects, and even tarantulas. *Overnight: Mashpi Lodge (B,L,D)*

Day +3: Mashpi Lodge / Mashpi Forest Canopy Exploration

Monday, April 12, 2021

As morning breaks, listen for the bright songs from the menagerie of birds stirring around the Lodge. A staggering 400 species of birds—including some 36 endemics—are estimated to inhabit the forest, and flutter through the canopy.

Mashpi is also home to a plethora of plant species, from ferns and bromeliads to a vast variety of orchid species—many newly discovered, which biologists come from the world over to observe.

For those who would like to enjoy the beauty of dawn in the forest, early morning activities are organized before breakfast. Spot birds and visit a hummingbird garden (host to 32 hummingbird species) with breakfast al fresco. The birds will be active and calling, and the views are often the most spectacular.

After lunch, take an opportunity to view the Mashpi Forest canopy during a guided ride

aboard the *Dragonfly*—an aerial cable car that offers a unique and spectacular way to see an expanse of the reserve. Go for the entire two-hour ride, or opt to combine the *Dragonfly* experience with a guided nature or waterfall hike.

Located close to the lodge, the Sky Bike makes for another unique and exciting way to explore the forest canopy. Designed for two people to use at once, you can pedal between two points of the forest approximately 655 feet apart. Next, climb the Observation Tower to take in the reserve in its entirety, and watch the sun set behind the clouds.

This evening, join fellow travelers to hear a collection of lectures by a resident biologist or naturalist, perhaps including "Secret Wildlife of Mashpi: the Camera Trap Project," "The Chocó: a Biological Hotspot" about the formation and diversity of the Chocó, or talks about current scientific research projects. *Overnight: Mashpi Lodge (B,L,D)*

Day +4: Mashpi / Quito / Main Program Begins

Tuesday, April 13, 2021 After a leisurely breakfast, take a group transfer to Quito to join guests arriving for the main program. (B,L)

B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D = Dinner
