
NOTE: Travel is a member benefit of the Alumni Association of the University of Michigan. Travelers, whether alumni or not, must be members. This includes all family members and friends.


Program Highlights



You will find the greatest concentration of prehistoric art sites anywhere in the world in the enchanting *département* of Dordogne. Limestone caves and rocky overhangs provided Ice Age humans with not only shelter, but also a vast canvas for extraordinary paintings. In Lascaux and Rouffignac—the two most well-known caves and both UNESCO World Heritage Sites—extinct aurochs, wild stallion, and antelopes that were painted over 17,000 years ago still prance, preen, and gallop before your eyes. The original Lascaux cave has been closed to the public since 1963 for preservation purposes; however, the incredible replica in the International Centre for Cave Art at Lascaux allows you to experience these iconic cave paintings interactively, providing a realistic, stimulating representation of the exuberant colors that have faded in the original cave.

Rouffignac offers up-close views of over 250 deft prehistoric drawings and paintings that cover a gallery of cavernous walls and ceilings, including the famous friezes of two bison ready to engage each other in battle and 10 mammoths in procession—one of the largest cave paintings ever discovered.

Near the village of Les Eyzies, visit the original Cro-Magnon rock shelter and UNESCO World Heritage Site of L'Abri de Cap-Blanc, showcasing the rare, life-size frieze of horses and bison sculpted in limestone. An expert-guided tour of the National Museum of Prehistory in Les Eyzies helps put this vast network of prehistoric art into context.





DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

Depart Home City Day 1

Bordeaux, France/ Sarlat-la-Canéda Day 2

Arrive in Bordeaux and transfer to Sarlat-la-Canéda. Check into the PLAZA MADELINE HÔTEL.

Sarlat-la-Canéda Day 3

Your charming "village home" is in the pre-French Revolution capital of Périgord Noir. It is a bon vivant's dream—with close proximity to Bordeaux. Stroll through cobblestone streets illuminated by gas lamps and lined with Renaissance-style stone houses. The cultural heart of Sarlat is the Place de la Liberté, where every Wednesday and Saturday one of France's most storied markets is held, a tradition dating from the Middle Ages.

Rocamadour/Souillac Day 4

The UNESCO World Heritage-designated Rocamadour has one of the most dramatic settings of any village in the world. During the Middle Ages, pilgrims flocked here from across Europe to perform penance by ascending the 216 steps of Le Grand Escalier on their knees—seeking miracles from the sacred 12th-century statue of the Black Virgin and Child at the crypt of Saint Amadour. Embedded in the cliff above the doorway to the Chapelle de Notre Dame is

a sword said to be that of the heroic knight Roland. Nearby, visit the quaint town of Souillac and its 12th-century Abbaye Sainte-Marie.

Eyrignac Gardens/ Les Eyzies-de-Tayac-Sireuil/L'Abri du Cap-Blanc Day 5

The Eyrignac Manor has been the continuous family residence of 22 generations spanning over 500 years. On this 17th-century estate located just outside the Lascaux cave, a repository of the most stunning works of prehistoric art and today a UNESCO World Heritage Site. See a perfect reproduction in the International Center for Cave Art at Lascaux. Continue to the petite village of Saint-Amand-de-Coly, officially designated as one of the "most beautiful villages" in France and dominated by the 13th-century abbey church, and then sample regional cheese and wine in a specialty épicerie in Sarlat.



of Sarlat, view what many consider the finest gardens in France. Enjoy a guided tour of the National Museum of Prehistory in Les Eyzies and see L'Abri du Cap-Blanc's UNESCO-designated prehistoric cave friezes. In Sarlat this evening, meet *dordognais* in the VILLAGE LIFE [®] forum.

Lascaux/Saint-Amandde-Coly Day 6

In 1940, a quartet of schoolboys stumbled onto

Rouffignac/ La Madeleine Day 7

Start your day at Sarlat's market, a twice-weekly medieval tradition in the heart of the village, and attend a presentation in the hotel by a local expert on preserving the village's medieval architecture.

Visit Rouffignac, "Cave of a Hundred Mammoths," known for its extraordinary Great Ceiling decorated with beautifully rendered



friezes of woolly rhinoceros and mammoth engravings at an enormous scale. Enjoy a private, 19th-century French folk music and dance performance after a three-course dinner in La Madeleine.

Beynac/Domme Day 8

Traverse an elaborate series of stone walls, parapet walks, watchtowers, and passageways at the fortified Château de Beynac. Cruise the Dordogne River aboard a private 19th-century *gabare*, followed by lunch in a local restaurant.

Continue to visit Domme, an authentic medieval fortified village. Enter through its original ramparts and see graffiti etched by the Knights Templar on the inner village walls.

Sarlat-la-Canéda/ Bordeaux/Return to Home City Day 9

Continue on to the Albi and Toulouse Post-Program Option or transfer to Bordeaux for your return flight.



Bordeaux and Saint-Émilion April 25 to 28, 2023

Start your trip with two nights in the Bordeaux region, long distinguished as the wine capital of the world. Visit a château in the nearby Médoc region to taste *grand cru classé* wines. Tucked away in the heart of the rolling countryside and endless vineyards, visit the charming village of Saint-Émilion, a UNESCO World Heritage Site famous for growing the merlot grape and for its medieval Église Monolithe, one of the largest underground churches in Europe.
